### Clergy Corner May 2023

Earlier this year a dear friend called to tell me she was going to finally walk away from a job that she had been pretty miserable in for some time. She said it was foolish since she had no prospects, but simply could not stay any longer in a position where she was so unhappy. While she was scared, there was nothing to do but to finally make this change.

Last week, she called with some news: "Devorah, you will not believe what has happened in the three months since I quit my job! I decided to apply for Rabbinic school-I have dreamed of this for years, and finally I had nothing to lose, so I applied and I got in! I'm going to finally study to be a Rabbi! And also I took a vacation to see an old friend-I haven't had the time or energy because of that miserable job, but when I quit I decided to pay her a visit, and while visiting we realized we have feelings for one another. I'm now in this beautiful relationship. And..."

The list of changes in her life in only about 12 weeks of time went on and on, as she marveled at how it seemed that everything had miraculously turned around. "I just don't understand it," she said, "how have all of these amazing things happened after so many years of nothing good?"

I laughed-because from the outside it seemed obvious-and said, "It could be that by walking away, freeing yourself from the bondage of that job, you allowed G-d to open doors for your future, free to walk the journey to what was really possible."

Shavuot, the festival holiday later this month, is celebrated with Torah study and cheesecake and ice cream, but it has much deeper meaning if we really look closely: The word Shavuot means "weeks," referring to the 7 weeks of the Omer counting which began the second evening of Pesach. This counting takes us on a spiritual journey in time, measuring our days out of Egypt and our state of slavery, through the parting of the Sea, and into the open Wilderness of the unknown. These 49 days measure our journey of stepping out boldly in faith, proclaiming that if we walk away from that which holds us back, we will find that which is to become our destiny.

This Shavuot, my hope is that our Beth El community will stand at Sinai with hearts open to receive what is there for us at this moment on our journey. The path has been diverse, at times exciting and wonderful, and at other times wandering and difficult, especially in the recent COVID years. Regardless of the terrain, it has been walked together in faith that our community will stand into the future: a future promised for us, for our Jewish values and traditions, and for generations to come.

Have a wonderful Spring, and may you be open for all that is to become yours on the Shavuot journey,



### A Shavuot Study with the Scholar:



From Purity and Impurity to Us and Them

The Torah recognizes a system of tumah and taharah, usually translated into English as "purity" and "impurity." Some of the practices connected to this system have fallen away over the many centuries since the Torah was given, while others have remained. The practice of ritually washing hands before eating bread or upon returning home from the cemetery, and the practice of ritual immersion in a mikvah still remain today.

There was a time in ancient Jewish history when non-Jews were considered "impure" although this belief was short lived and died out before the 1st c CE. Today the boundary between Jew and non-Jew is pretty clearly defined, even as we love our non-Jewish neighbours. Yet new issues constantly emerge that challenge the careful balance we strive to create. What can the Torah's ancient system teach us about the contemporary categories of "us" and "them?" How should we use this wisdom to achieve what is just and right?



## Jewish Book Club Sponsored by Congregation Beth El



### The Storyteller by Jodi Picoult - Part II



If you haven't already read this book, and since we will be meeting in just a few days, this month's book club page may only lead you to read it in the future. I have no idea how many people read this page beyond the dozen "members" of the group, but I have been told that it serves as pointer towards some books of Jewish interest which would have gone unnoticed. Jodi Picoult is an author I have long been aware of because her books have so often been huge best-sellers, but I have never read any of them before because I thought they were just popular romance novels. Now that I have read *The Storyteller*, I may try some of her other books. Last month's *Bulletin* told you a bit of the synopsis of the novel and I won't repeat that. Because I am writing this page during the week of Yom HaShoah, I will note that Part II of this three-part book is told in her own words by Minka Singer, the protagonist's grandmother: her detailed and harrowing story of her life from childhood and adolescence in Lodz, to Auschwitz, to Bergen-Belsen, and to

liberation by the British army. Most elements may be familiar to Jewish readers, but I wonder how many of Picoult's loyal general readers encountered the brutal truth of the Holocaust for the first time.

Of course, *The Storyteller* also has a romance with the coming together of Sage Singer, the lost soul and literally scarred granddaughter of survivor Minka, and Leo Stein, the unmarried War Crimes lawyer from the US Department of Justice. Interwoven throughout the novel is the imaginative werewolf story that Minka has created. Telling the story bit by bit to the SS officer she worked for is what helped her survive at Auschwitz.

This novel is far more than an ordinary romance genre work, and like all Picoult's work, touches on the important issues of life today. Over her writing career, Picoult has covered a wide range of controversial or moral issues, including abortion, the Holocaust, assisted suicide, race relations, eugenics, LGBT rights, fertility issues, religion, the death penalty, and school shootings. She has been described as, "a paradox, a hugely popular, at times controversial writer, ignored by academia, who questions notions of what constitutes literature simply by doing what she does best." As she herself has said, "I'm never going to win the Nobel prize for literature, not going to win a National Book award, never even going to be



nominated. What you trade for that is sales and readership. And I would rather reach more people. It would be very nice to not be unfairly accused of being a bad writer, but hopefully if you do pick up one of my books, you will be quickly disabused of that notion."

The Board of Directors considered the impact of this new legislation at their Board Meeting convened October 16th, 2018. At that time, the Board agreed that not only would the recreational use of Cannabis on Beth El property not be in keeping with the family values that Beth El aspires to, but the recreational use of Cannabis in public places is still prohibited, despite the new legislation. The Board accordingly unanimously agreed to prohibit the use of Cannabis on Beth El property, at all times. The Board asks that Members and their guests respect this decision and adhere to it fully.

The Beth El Cemetery is open:


