Clergy Corner August 2023

But ask the animals, and they will teach you, or the birds in the sky, and they will tell you; or speak to the earth, and it will teach you, or let the fish in the sea inform you. Which of all these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this? In his hand is the life of every creature and the breath of all mankind."

Job 12:7-10

Just because hens are laying eggs does not mean that hens are interested in motherhood. This is a truth I have learned on our little farm in Michigan where we tend to gather an overabundance of eggs every summer, but rarely hatch baby chicks. A hen has to want to take on this task of sitting on eggs for about four weeks, to be diligent and gentle and patient, called to this specific purpose. Most of the time the hens are not interested in such work, so the eggs sit and we gather them.

But this spring we noticed one of our hens was "broody"—she was up to the task! While we were excited, we also knew this was never a sure thing, and as the weeks passed, Jim became doubtful that any of the eggs would hatch. "It's been too long," he lamented, "they should have hatched last week." I was more hopeful: "Give her time. She knows when they are ready." And so it was that in the end FIVE babies peaked their little heads out from under the mama hen's wings! She did it!

Some hens are not natural mothers, but this mama hen was excellent; protective and caring for her babies, keeping them safe and warm under her wings. For a few days she tended them, and then we noticed something we had not seen with other hens: she was not getting up from her nest—she was doing it again, sitting on three more eggs while caring for her five babies. This was the mama hen of all mama hens, a bird with a mission to expand the flock!

All went well for a couple of weeks, but then there was a setback, as one of the chicks had an injured leg. Her only chance was a large fish tank placed in the coop so mama hen could see her and so she could stay still, protected, and heal. For five days the poor injured baby just sat in the hay in the fishtank alone, crying for her mama through the glass. When I would take her fresh water or food, mama hen would get ruffled feathers and come at me aggressively—a good sign! She still wanted to protect her baby! But the baby's leg looked no better and she wasn't eating or drinking or growing.

Jim was concerned. "You know, I think that baby isn't going to make it, she isn't going to walk again. I think if there's any hope, you need to add her to your prayer list." I was quite sad with his assessment, so that night I said a prayer for the baby bird as I fell asleep, imagining in my mind her little leg straightening out and working again.

Early the next morning I went out to see her sad situation, but when I opened the door to the coop, to my surprise and delight she was up eating, drinking, and limping around the fish tank! She was going to make it. "Well, it looks like we almost gave up on you twice—as a little egg and now as a little chick! We need to learn to wait and have some faith!"

Rosh Chodesh Elul falls on the evening of August 16th this year, and begins the month when we are called to prepare our hearts and minds for the holiest days of the year. During the month of Elul it is traditional to read the entirety of Psalm 27 every day, as part of that preparation. The last verse is my favourite:

"Wait on Adonai; be of courage and he will strengthen your heart; and wait, I say, on Adonai." Psalm 27:14

What does it mean, though, to "wait on G-d?" And what does my story of the chickens possibly have to do with Elul and Psalm 27?

Well, when we wait on G-d, we make intentional opportunity for internal change; we give the Divine permission to work in our hearts and minds, so that we can grow and strengthen and receive healing. We focus our minds to hear what perhaps we are being called to do—much as our mama hen responded to a need for new life in the flock by feeling an urge to sit on not one, but two clutches of eggs!

When we wait on G-d, the growth and change can be hidden from us, and we may think, "I've been doing the things in my life I am called to, but I see no change, I feel no different, I see no results in the world." We learn again from our mama hen that sometimes it takes a few extra days of patient faithfulness to the work we do in the world for the miracle to be seen—-for what is hidden to be revealed and come forth in its time.

When we wait on G-d, our heart is strengthened, but it will take trust and faithfulness to a process which may be painful and difficult. We witnessed that while our baby bird had to experience physical separation which caused loneliness and heartache, this separation also allowed for the healing and protection she needed to survive.

It's amazing that through all of Creation we can witness the Divine at work, not only in the lives of humans, but even in the lives of little birds. I pray that Elul will bring strength and courage to all of Creation, all of humanity, to all of us as individuals, to the Beth El community, and to all of us who are called to be a Light to this World.







### Jewish Book Club Sponsored by Congregation Beth El



#### All About Me by Mel Brooks



We look forward to a real change of pace in our next selection: show business instead of *shoah*. At 97 years old, Mel Brooks is older than any of us in the Beth El book club, and since he has been part of the entertainment experience for all of us from the early days of live television to Hollywood film and Broadway theater to lifetime achievement awards in 2023, his autobiography presents us with social history, entertainment business history and reference to many of the moments which marked our lives. Brooks has written a long book – over 500 pages long – but it is an easy book to read, and you can read each chapter as carefully or as casually as you choose. While most of the 26 chapters carry the names of his productions, some of the best chapters refer to significant parts of his early life and his later development.

All About Me! charts Mel Brooks' meteoric rise from a Depression-era kid in Brooklyn to the recipient of the National Medal of Arts. Whether serving in the United States Army in World War II, or during his burgeoning career as a teenage comedian in the Catskills, Mel was always mining his experiences for material, always looking for the perfect joke. His amazing career began with Sid Caesar's Your Show of Shows, where he was part of perhaps the greatest writers' room in history which included Carl Reiner, Neil Simon, and Larry Gelbart. After co-creating both the mega-hit The 2000 Year Old Man comedy albums and the classic television series Get Smart, Brooks' film career took off, culminating in his conquering Broadway with his record-breaking, Tony-winning musical, The Producers.

The Forward's arts critic asked: "How did Brooks' comedic genius arise? We have Williamsburg, the Catskills and the U.S. Army to thank. Episodes of Melvin Kaminsky, the youngest of four boys raised by a single widowed mother, are the most vivid parts of the book, not weighed down by a litany of film and production dates or the onus of A-list cameos at a studio commissary...These juvenilia and the glimpses into Sid Caesar's writers room make for the book's best stuff." What may not be the best is also very, very good, and the fun of talking about it when we meet should match the fun of reading his story as Mel Brooks tells it.

[And if You] Obey [These Rules]

Deuteronomy

7:12-11:25 August 5, 2023

Moses tells the Israelites that if they follow God's laws, the nations who now dwell across the Jordan River will not harm them. (7:12–26)

Moses reminds the people of the virtues of keeping God's commandments. He also tells them that they will dispossess those who now live in the Land only because they are idolatrous, not because the Israelites are uncommonly virtuous. Thereupon, Moses reviews all of the trespasses of the Israelites against God. (8:1–10:11)

Moses says that the Land of Israel will overflow with milk and honey if the people obey God's commandments and teach them to their children. (10:12–11:25)





R'eih רֵאֶה :

See [This Day I Set Before You Blessing and Curse]

Deuteronomy 11:26-16:17

August 12, 2023

God places both blessing and curse before the Israelites. They are taught that blessing will come through the observance of God's laws. (11:26–32)

Moses' third discourse includes laws about worship in a central place (12:1–28); injunctions against idolatry (12:29–13:19) and self-mutilation (14:1–2); dietary rules (14:3–21); and laws about tithes (14:22–25), debt remission (15:1–11), the release and treatment of Hebrew slaves (15:12–18), and firstlings (15:19–23).

Moses reviews the correct sacrifices to be offered during the Pilgrim Fe<mark>stivals—Pesach, Sukkot, and Shavuot. (16:1-17)</mark>

Deuteronomy 16:18-21:9

August 19, 2023

Laws regarding both sacred and secular legislation are addressed. The Israelites are told that in every dealing they should pursue justice in order to merit the land that God is giving them. (16:18–18:8)

The people are warned to avoid sorcery and witchcraft, the abhorrent practices of their idolatrous neighbors. (18:9–22)
